**Pol Roger, Brut Vintage** **2000** **84.00**

A harmonious balance of weight, acidity and fruit set this wine apart. Crisp styling sets the scene with a nose of fresh flowers and sweet spice, moving to a plate of fresh pastries and complex fruit.

**7 Bollinger, Grande Année** **2000** **99.50**

An assemblage 65% Pinot Noir and 35% Chardonnay is used to great effect, producing a dry, full bodied wine with whiffs of sultanas and roasted nuts on beautifully balanced, mature length.

## PRESTIGE CUVÉES

**8 Cuvée Dom Perignon** **2003** **152.00**

The inimitable DP still enjoys star status. An incisive acidic freshness on the first taste is followed by ripe, light coloured fruit flavours on a palate that offers hints of vanilla, melba toast and finesse.

**9 Krug Grand Cuvée** **NV** **168.00**

Considered the Englishman's fizz. Classic, mellow and rich. A very full bodied style due to fermentation in oak.

**11 Louis Roederer Cristal** **2004** **198.00**

Invented for the sweet-toothed Russian Tsars. Now the most natural of all the prestige Cuvées, reflecting the quality of each vintage. Superlative !

## PRESTIGE CUVÉES ROSÉ

**14 Cuvée Dom Perignon Rosé** **2000** **350.00**

Luxuriously creamy prestige cuvée rosé. The wine's delicious berry flavours explode in the mouth then linger endlessly. A must for that ultimate special occasion.

## DEMI SEC CHAMPAGNE

**15 Veuve Clicquot White Label, Demi Sec** **NV** **64.00**

A fresh, citrusy first taste is followed by a veritable explosion of soft fruit flavours, which ambush and enchant the senses with a velvety sweetness under a vivacious mousse. A truly delightful wine.

## ROSÉ CHAMPAGNE

**16 Lallier Premier Cru Rose Brut** **NV** **49.50**

A pretty pale pink champagne of exhilarating freshness, elegance and red subtlety, it captures clean fresh red fruit on the nose, followed by lively fresh fruit flavours on the palate with an appealing softness. Elegant and very shippable – the perfect champagne combination.




**Joseph Perrier, Cuvée Royale Rosé** **NV** **56.00**  
 A richly styled wine from this family run estate, founded in 1825. The full juicy palate is deftly balanced with subtle ginger-nut biscuit notes and lively acidity, among the rounded red fruit length.

**18 Laurent Perrier, Brut Rosé** **NV** **72.00**  
 The fruity style is apparent immediately on a nose of raspberries, cherries and even gooseberries. The soft fruits continue on the palate, with added briôche touches and a fine, delicate acidity.

### SPARKLING WINE

**21 Prosecco Frizzante, Domenico de Bertiol, Italy** **NV** **24.75**  
 The classic Italian aperitif with a gentle fizz and apple and pear fruits. Used in Harry's Bar, Venice to make Bellinis.

**22 Taltarni Brut Tache (Rose), Australia** **2010** **29.50**  
 'Tache' meaning to stain in French refers to the rare winemaking method used by Taltarni to create this fine champagne method rose. A dash of red wine liqueur is added to the finished wine at disgorgement to create a wonderful salmon pink colour. More than a match for many champagne roses with an assortment of red berry fruits, Turkish delight and rose petal complemented by complex yeasty nougat nuances.

**23 Cloudy Bay, Pelorus** **2008** **36.00**  
 The vineyards of the superlative Cloudy Bay produce this lovely, aromatic sparkler. Champagne it ain't but the toasted Briôche palate with afterthoughts of apple pie is so indulgent and tempting.

**25 Hennes Vintage, England** **2009** **42.00**  
 Fantastic sparkling wine tasting of biscuit brioche on the nose, with delicate white flower and full fruit. Citrus apple and 'leesy' characters add complexity to the palate.

## SOUTH WEST FRANCE

- 30 Madiran, Charles de Batz, Domaine Berthoumieu 2007 31.95**  
Are you man enough to try the Madiran? Made from the local Tannat grape - Tannat by name, Tannic by nature - which as its name suggests has very thick skins, which produce big tannic wines. However Didier Barre's manages to produce rich dark wines, which also have balance and finesse - yes there are tannins but these glide over your palate and when served with game or a big steak you really get to understand what this award winning wine is all about.

## BURGUNDY RED

- 33 Beaujolais Villages, Domaine de la Côte Fleurie – Beaujolais 2013 18.90**  
The Chatelus family produce magical wines from this 20 hectare estate in Saint-Laurent d'Oingt. Light but captivating depths of mulberry and raspberry fruit, the true expression of the Gamay grape.
- 34 Fleurie, La Reine de l'Arenite, La Madone – Beaujolais 2013 23.60**  
The best known of the Beaujolais villages, this Fleurie is from the Chanudet family's La Madone vineyard, where 'arenite', a pinkish sandstone dominates the soil. Elegant and concentrated with ripe berry fruits and a violet lift. Can also be served chilled.
- 35 Joseph Drouhin Chorey-les-Beaune, Cote de Beaune, France 2011 28.50**  
Very bright fruit with sweet cherries and strawberries with a very nice balance
- 36 Côte de Beaune Villages, Domaine Albert Bichot 2007 32.50**  
Juicy strawberry and raspberry flavours show strongly in this sumptuous Burgundy. This fruity style is supple and ever approachable, demonstrating the step from Gamay to Pinot Noir delicately.
- 37 Chassagne Montrachet, Domaine Bouchot-Ludot 2011 38.50**  
Plummy, red currant and tobacco hint on the nose with a fullish body and soft velvety tannins. Ready for drinking now..
- 38 Gevrey Chambertin, 1er Cru Les Champeaux, Domaine Vallet Freres 2005 52.00**  
Gevrey Chambertin lies at the foot of the Combe de Lauvaux, velvety textures in a garnet shade announce a palate of soft blackcurrant encircled by earthy overtones with hints of fig and violet.
- 40 Volnay, Domaine Michel Lafarge, 2009 58.50**  
Compelling nose with really good depth of aromas, with notes of earth, tea, tobacco, stems liquorice, spice, rosehip and quite a stunning array of red fruits. With impressive stuffing, structure and spiciness for a volnay.

## BORDEAUX RED

- 64 Château Clou Du Pin, Bordeaux Superieur** **2010** **22.00**  
This wine has a taste of wild blackberry fruits with a slight touch of tannin in the after taste.
- 65 Château Moulin Bellegrave, St Emilion** **2011** **29.80**  
This dense wine boasts an intense crimson-tinted robe. This wine offers a nose of very ripe black cherries. The mouth-feel entices due by its fullness, richness, fullness as well as by the aromatic feel on the palate.
- 66 Clos de la Cure, Grand Cru, St Emilion** **2010** **37.50**  
This complex wine is opaque in colour and shows aromas of sweet blackcurrant leaf and a hint of cedar on the nose with a rather herbal finish. Superb structure with solid, tight tannins and a long satisfying finish.

## BORDEAUX CRU BOURGEOIS RED

- 69 Château de L'Estang, Castillon – Côtes de Bordeaux** **2009** **34.00**  
The 2009 L'Estang exhibits lots of sweet blackcurrant and black cherry fruit intermixed with a hint of vanillia. Medium to full-bodied, with surprisingly pure, concentrated, lengthy flavours.
- 72 Château Moulinet, Pomerol** **2008** **65.00**  
Well-extracted aroma of leafy red fruit, leather and classy oak. Polished palate performance, delivering scented fruit, fleshy texture with perky tannins.
- 73 Château Caronne Ste Gemme, Cru Bourgeois Haut Médoc** **2005** **45.00**  
45 hectares of vineyard situated close to St Julien, tended by the Nony family has produced a soft fruity wine, showing aged blackcurrant fruits and malleable tannins on an impressive length.
- 74 Château Cissac, Cru Bourgeois Haut Médoc** **2006** **55.00**  
The Vailard family use traditional, 90 year old oak casks, imparting rich textures in the wine. The palate is mature, well structured, displaying a persistent, deep, spicy plum and blackcurrant persona.
- 75 Château d'Angludet, Cru Bourgeois Margaux** **2001** **54.00**  
The drainage allowed by gravely soil in Margaux gives the grapes (mostly Cabernet Sauvignon) a high fruit concentration that is translated into a full, lingering palate, full of warm, sweet plums.
- 76 Chateau Bellegrave, Pomerol** **2009** **59.00**  
A blend of 75% Merlot, 20% Cabernet-Franc and 5% Cabernet Sauvignon. This great vintage has produced an inky black wine with stunning plumy fruit.

 Considered one of the 'Super Seconds' this wine is very fine, full of dark cassis and ripe stylish tannin. It consists of 73% Cabernet Sauvignon, 10% Cabernet Franc, 15% Merlot and 2% Petit Verdot.
- 86 Château-Figeac 1er Grand Cru St. Emilion** **1998 125.00**  
 75% Merlot and 25% Cabernet Franc, constitute a wine with swathes of blackcurrant jam and black cherry jam flavours. Damson and star anise with smoky oak show on a truly memorable finish. Great vintage, drinking superbly now.
- 87 Carruades de Lafite - Pauillac** **2001 175.00**  
 The second wine of the famous Lafite Rothschild with elusive perfume and style. The more approachable 2001 vintage offers great drinking at a great price.
- 88 Château Haut-Brion, 1er Cru Classé, Pessac-Leognan** **2002 380.00**  
 Complex aromas of blackberries, tobacco and cedar follow through to a full-bodied palate, with ripe, velvety tannins and a long, caressing finish. Very beautiful.
- 89 Château Mouton Rothschild – 1er Cru - Pauillac** **1997 350.00**  
 An intense flavoured wine showing blackcurrant and cassis with firm tannins giving excellent structure and balance.
- 90 Château Pontet-Canet** **2009 245.00**  
 Vibrant hue, bright, red-purple hue. Very dark concentrated fruit on the nose, dense forest fruit character. Plum and cherry, especially the latter. Lovely texture in entry, very creamy but also tightly defined, rather than soft or overly broad. Underneath this, a rich layer of tannin, all very composed, although rich and substantial. The fruit has a dense, black cherry edge with a crunchy spark to it. The tannins are rich and mouth coating, like heavy velvet curtains, but are in keeping with the rest of the wine. It has a union of massive structure, cleanly defined fruit and also freshness and acidity – quite a remarkable feat. Peppery acidity with it. Lovely fresh fruit. - 92 'Les Cerisiers' Côtes du Rhône, Boutinot** **2013 21.50**  
 A rich and voluptuous southern Rhone rosé laden with fine redcurrant and strawberry fruit.

### RHÔNE VALLEY RED

- 93 Chateau L'Ermitage 'Tradition' Rouge, Costieres Nimes** **2011 21.00**  
 Brightly garnet in colour. This wine is full of taste with a good fruity and spicy structure. A 'thirst-quenching' wine with supple tannins.



- 94 'Les Coteaux' Côtes du Rhône Villages, Boutinot** **2010** **21.95**  
 'Quite how the winemakers have managed to produce a Gold List-winning Rhône red at this price, I have no idea. Ridiculously good value, with approachable fruit but also a real sense of place'

- 96 Gigondas, Domaine la Haute Marone** **2011** **29.95**  
 Intense aromas of ripe raspberries and black cherries, then a wisp of smoke creeps in along with some hints of grilled cocoa beans. Before the wine hits the palate, you know that you're in for an explosion of flavours! Deep and intense, this wine slowly reveals its secrets - black cherries, dark chocolate, a hint of clove and nutmeg.
- 97 Crozes Hermitage les Meysonniers, Chapoutier** **2010** **32.95**  
 The vineyards at the foot of Hermitage vie for space with peach orchards! The Syrah fruit offers a substantial palate of spiced red fruits, with obvious smoked oak and hints of appealing liquorice.
- 98 Châteauneuf du Pape, Domaine Chante Cigale** **2011** **35.50**  
 The former residence of the Popes of Avignon overlooks vineyards growing 13 varieties of grape. A palate of powerful stewed fruits, black pepper and cinnamon spice with a balancing lemon acidity.
- 99 Châteauneuf du Pape, Domaine du Vieux Télégraphe** **2006** **79.50**  
 The internationally acclaimed Domaine du Vieux Télégraphe is the jewel in the Brunier family's significant winemaking crown which gives a wine of garrigue aromas leading to a palate of cherry and ripe fresh black fruits.
- 100 Hermitage, Monier de la Sizeranne, Chapoutier** **1994** **49.50**  
 A blend of grapes from the top vineyards, Le Meal, Les Bessards and Les Greffieux matured in oak casks (33% new) this wine is neither filtered nor fined. A super wine that combines soft elegance with powerful concentrated tannins and juicy blackcurrant, almost liquorice fruit. An outstanding price.
- 101 Cote Rotie 'Fortis', Domaine du Montelilet** **2007** **58.00**  
 Elegance personified. The best of the tiny region of Cote Rotie takes the Shiraz/Syrah grape and turns it almost into Eau du Syrah, like this fine example made by rising star Stephane Montez. It has everything you could want in a wine, purity of dense fruit, finesse, wonderful aromatics and a long and complex finish.

## RHÔNE VALLEY WHITE

- 102 Châteauneuf du Pape, Domaine Chante Cigale** **2012** **35.50**  
 An outstanding savoury experience, from Grenache Blanc, Clairette, Roussane and Picoul fruit. Dried fruit, almonds and a signature of wood is joined by apricot and pear fruit and citrus overtones.



**103 Condrieu, Les Grandes Chaillees 2012 49.50**

A fantastic example of the greatness the Viognier grape can achieve with an intoxicating perfume of peach, apricot and Turkish delight musk, which carry through to the palate with a dreamy texture reminiscent of great white burgundies like Puligny Montrachet, but the flavours are unmistakable Condrieu at its finest.

## LANGUEDOC WHITE

**104 Ardeche Chardonnay, IGP Coteaux de l'Ardeche, Louis Latour 2012 24.40**

A extremely well made chardonnay from the Ardeche, a buttery and peachy with a long finish, I had to double-check the very non-grand-cru price.

## LANGUEDOC RED

**105 Les Cepages Oublies Carnignan-Grenache Vieilles Vignes, Pays d'Oc 2012 16.50**

Great raspberry and cherry nose, hints of cloves with blackberry and custard. The palate is softer Slightly less intense, with refreshing acidity to finish.

**106 Old Vines Carignan Xavier Roger 2012 21.95**

This juicy wine has a beautiful cherry red colour. The nose shows an abundance of intense red berry fruit and hints of vanilla flavours. The palate is soft, full flavoured with a smooth easy drinking finish.

**107 Château Blason d'Aussières, Les Domaines Barons De Rothschild (Lafite) 2009 25.90**

Beautiful dark red colour with hints of violet. The nose is already very intense, with dark fruit (blackberries) and garrigue combining with notes of red fruit and the elegance of tannins which are immediately apparent. The palate then develops, with lots of roundness, to more complex notes of spices and garrigue.

**108 Château d'Aussières, Les Domaines Barons De Rothschild (Lafite) 2010 37.80**

The wine is a very deep garnet red colour. The nose has intense aromas of fresh red fruits and spices. The oak is well integrated in the heart of the wines aromatic structure. At first on the palate the wine is quite reserved and then rapidly opens out. It is rich, balanced and elegant. The tannins are tight and silky. Crispy fruit. The retro-olfaction is spicy and floral with a long and dense finish.

## LOIRE VALLEY WHITE

**110 Vouvray, Les Coteaux Tufiers 2013 22.50**

Beautifully balanced with a hint of sweetness and acidity with fresh fruit flavours, this wine will begin to offer honeyed fruit with great complexity over the next five years.



**111 Pouilly Fume, Domaine de la Renardiere** **2013** **29.95**  
The father and son team of Bernard and Arnaud Bouchie received a well deserved IWC Silver medal winner for this wine. Exhibiting classic Sauvignon characters of herbaceous gooseberry fruit with a hint of steely gunflint that gives the wines from Pouilly sur Loire their 'Fume' title.

**112 Sancerre Domaine Michel Girard** **2013** **29.95**  
Pure Sauvignon style with fragrant aromas of grapefruit followed onto the palate by gooseberry citrus fruits. A perfect match with fish but amazing with goats cheese.

## LOIRE VALLEY RED

**114 Sancerre Rouge, Domaine du Pré Semelé** **2013** **29.95**  
Red fruits aromas, with a touch of cherry and prune and vanilla. Silky and round structure. Tight and discreet tannins. Red fruits dominate the palate (raspberries and cherries), with an exceptional elegance and finesse.

## LOIRE VALLEY ROSÉ

**115 Sancerre Rosé, Domaine du Pré Semelé** **2013** **29.95**  
Pale and elegant – quite exquisite. Fresh floral perfume interlaced with strawberries, very pretty and appealing. Palate is clean, fresh and zippy.

## ALSACE WHITE

**117 Riesling, Turckheim Vieilles Vignes** **2009** **24.90**  
Very pale in green colour. Highly aromatic, with notes of citrus, grapefruit and other exotic fruit. The taste is quite full, fruity and long with a good crisp finish.

**118 Gewürztraminer Cave de Turckheim, Vieilles Vignes** **2011** **29.95**  
Pale golden with a classic Gewurz nose of Turkish delight, rose water and lychees. Full rich palate of exotic fruit, rambutans, honey, marmalade and a hint of lavender. Fantastically scrumptious.

## REGIONAL FRANCE RED

**120 Mas de Vignerons (Alexandra Rouge), Vin de Pays Vaucluse** **2012** **16.00**  
Soft easy drinking Southern Rhone style with peppery red and black cherries, with a hint of spice.

**122 Pasquiers Shiraz, Vin de Pays d'Oc** **2013** **18.90**  
A clever blend (first used in Cote Rotie and today in expensive Aussie blends) that uses the white Viognier grape with its apricot and honey blossom perfumed fruit to balance the rich ripe black cherry fruit, pepper and spice of the Shiraz.



## REGIONAL FRANCE WHITE

- 124 Mas de Vignerons (Alexandra Sec), Vin de Pays Côtes de Gascogne** **2013** **16.00**  
The second wine made by Cheshire winemaker Paul Boutinot named after his younger son is fresh and fragrant with crisp green fruit.
- 125 Les Cepages Oublies Gros Manseng Colombard, Pays de Cotes de Gasgogne 2011** **2013** **16.50**  
Lovely grassy aromatic nose (reminiscent of sauvignon blanc), with hints of tropical melon and pink grapefruit. The palate is softer and creamier than you would expect, given the invigorating nose. Fresh lemon. with hints of nuttiness and a wonderful palate weight, giving the wine real texture.
- 127 Domaine de Vedilhan Serica, Viognier** **2012** **23.95**  
This wine was crafted by barrel-fermenting. The result is a richly textured wine with an equally luxurious label. The result is Serica Viognier. Aromas and flavours of ripe peach mingle with warmer more exotic notes of pure hedonism interwoven with smooth oaky layers.

## REGIONAL FRANCE ROSÉ

- 128 Louis Alexandra Rosé, Vin de Pays Côtes de Gascogne** **2013** **16.00**  
A fresh ruby rosé with bright red berry fruits.

## SPAIN ROSÉ

- 129 Artesa Rosado, Rioja** **2013** **19.95**  
A rounded, medium bodied, dry rose. Gently fruity on the nose with strawberry and cherry aromas, quite full in flavour with soft berry fruits and spiciness on the finish

## SPAIN WHITE

- 130 Borsao Seleccion Blanco, Campo de Borja** **2011** **21.95**  
Delicious white made from the local Macabeo grape to produce a wine which is citrusy and bright on the palate, with pineapple and tropical fruit flavours. Unoaked, with a long, juicy finish.
- 131 Vetiver Rioja Blanco** **2012** **21.95**  
Stylish white rioja from Rioja Baja with subtle floral hints, followed by a voluptuous mouth-feel of tropical fruit, white pepper and toast characters. Well-balanced, with fine, natural acidity.



## SPAIN WHITE

- 132 Catalan Eagle White, Garnacha Blanca, Viognier and Roussanne** **2013** **24.00**  
A delicate multi-layered organic white from Catalonia with a floral nose with white stone fruit, grapefruit and an earthy clay note. The palate has more stonefruit and citrus, with more precise flavours of pear and melon and minerality, with warm spice and savoury notes. The wine has a rich texture and is wonderfully integrated.
- 133 Bodegas La Val, Orballo** **2012** **26.95**  
Albarino grape with ripe aromatics with layers of peach, floral and honeyed notes which mingle with mountain herbs and a sweeter mandarin skin and apple note. Generous on the palate with a weighty leesy texture, ripe fruit and minerality all balanced by a refreshing smack of acidity.

## SPAIN RED

- 134 Pedrera, Monastrell, Jumilla** **2012** **17.50**  
Ripe, Juicy and forward with aromas of crunchy red berries, cherry plum and strawberry. Fresh and Forward, the palate is fruit focussed with more ripe bramble and plum fruit, a hint of spice and mocha. Some weight and complexity with a supple finish.
- 135 Bodegas Borsao, Seleccion Tinto** **2012** **21.80**  
Rich, plummy and chocolatey fruit on the nose. Nicely balanced, lightly perfume red fruit mix with darker spice and chocolate notes to give weight and texture to the palate. Plump soft tannins award an enjoyable finish.
- 136 The Charge La Bascula Temranillo Garnacha – Rioja** **2011** **22.95**  
Another classic red from La Bascula, tasting of red berry and spicy fruit characters with refreshing acidity, balanced by fine vanilla flavours from oak maturation.
- 137 Turret Fields La Bascula Monastrelle Syrah** **2010** **23.50**  
An elegant red from the indomitable Bruce Jack. A characteristically rich and powerful Monastrelle-based red. Low yielding 30-40 year old vines produce concentrated, warm and ripe fruit. There's also subtle spice and refined perfume from a 20% dash of Syrah.
- 138 Juan Gil Gold Label 4 Meses Monastrell, Jumilla** **2011** **24.50**  
A beautiful Monastrell from 40 year old vines. Tasting of juicy blackberry and plum fruit, delicate vanilla spice and cedar. The palate mirrors the nose with layers of lush spicy plum and cherry fruit, more sweet spice, minerality and gentle tannins to the finish.
- 139 Juan Gil Silver Label 12 Meses Monastrell, Jumilla** **2011** **28.50**  
Densely coloured wine with a high impact impressive nose. Spice, cedar toast and chocolate are layered with blackberry and plum. The palate has lots of juicy ripe plum, and a textural earthy chocolate sensation. Tannins build to the finish. A complex wine with great balance, concentration and length.



**Tres Picos, Bodegas Borsao, Campo de Borja**

**2011 32.95**

We think this is like Spain's version of Chateaufort du Pape, but here is Robert Parker (highly influential wine critic) thinks: -

'This remarkably hedonistic wine has been a perennial Best Buy... The 2009 Tres Picos Garnacha is purple coloured with a cherry-scented nose that roars from the glass. It is intensely fruity, with terrific depth and concentration, oodles of sweet fruit and terrific length. This wine which can be likened to cherry pie in a glass, is awesome value.'

**141 Marques de Murrieta, Reserva – Rioja**

**2007 32.00**

88% 20 year old Tempranillo vines with 8% Garnacha Tinta and 4% Mazuelo seasoning, aged in oak for 24 months. Discreet oak balances a palate of liquorice and stewed berries and damson with a lasting sensation of sweet style from one of the top Bodegas.

**141 Juan Gil Blue Label 18 Meses Monastrell, Jumilla**

**2011 35.00**

**A** Made mostly with very old Monastrell grapes from very old vines, including very low yields as with the vines of Cabernet Sauvignon and Syrah to obtain a very concentrated and complex wine. Purple/black in colour, it proffers a nose of pain grille, graphite, earth notes, spice box, black fruits and a hint of balsamic. It opens in the glass to reveal excellent density, savoury flavours, plenty of spice and a lengthy pure finish.

**SPAIN RED**

**142 Dominio de Atauta, Ribera Del Duero**

**2009 38.50**

Fantastic wine from the Ribera - a result of seriously old vines. Rich aromas of black cherry and plum, and smoky, mocha notes. Ripe fruit flavours combine with a darker, more brooding, wild character and hints of garrigue which open up in the glass. Chewy and with ample ripe tannins.

**143 Bodegas Larchago, Gran Reserva – Izarbe**

**2001 39.50**

Old vine Tempranillo and Mazuelo fruit is selected, vinified then aged in oak for almost 3 years. Giving it a swathes of dark fruits, spice, and vanilla thus giving it a wonderful balance.

**144 Clio, Bodegas El Nido – Jumilla**

**2007 49.50**

The wine is a dark cherry red with an intense nose of ripe cassis fruit, toasted coffee and liquorice - and all the power and concentration you would expect from this kind of international project. These notes follow through onto the palate with savoury characters, spicy rich fruit flavours, smoky oak and firm tannins - but overall elegance.

**145 Pago De Los Capellanes Reserva – Ribera-Del-Duero**

**2004 54.00**

This dense inky wine displays great finesse and complex cassis characters on the nose. The palate is fine, poised and has great purity - a truly exceptional wine with herbal, vanilla, liquorice and blackberry flavours, firm and well structured tannins and a very long finish.

**146 Dalmau Reserva – Marqués de Murrieta Rioja**

**2002 82.00**

Dalmau is characterized by its bright, garnet red colour which has a deliciously sweet nose, showing dense fruit, over a layer of deep, spicy complexity. The palate is full, creamy, sweet, grippy and structured.



- 147 El Picon Reserva Especial – Ribera-Del-Duero** **1998 125.00**  
 One of Spain's finest wines sourced from a small 2 hectare vineyard that has its own unique clone of Tempranillo. Impressive marriage of power and elegance with ripe plum and blackberry fruits, violets and rich chocolate, mineral and game flavours. In fact this is world-class stuff !!
- 148 El Nido, Bodegas El Nido – Jumilla** **2009 128.00**  
 An intense and concentrated red, with opulent ripe fruit and unrestrained richness - but finesse too, with delicate wild berry fruit, subtle aromatics and good length. What the Italians would call a 'vino da meditazione', with multi-layered flavours and complexity.
- 148 Vega Sicilia Valbuena – Ribera-Del-Duero** **2008 175.00**  
**A** The second wine of Vega Sicilia, one of Ribera del Duero's most prestigious estates, specialising in the production of blends from local Tempranillo clones, with small additions of Cabernet Sauvignon, Merlot and Malbec. Valbuena is made from the fruit of the estate's younger vines, aged over 3 years in new and old oak casks. It has a garnet cherry red colour with orange undertones and mixes softness and ripeness of fruit with an ethereal, well-evolved character.
- 148 Vega Sicilia "Unico" – Ribera-Del-Duero** **2003 320.00**  
**B** Spain's legendary, iconic red, collected by royals and celebrities throughout the world, this rarely seen wine is truly sensational. Fabulous depth and structure with layers of mature dark berry aromas. A rich palate conjuring up flavours of smoky damson, cedar wood and tobacco. The length is quite astonishing.

## ITALY ROSÉ

- 149 Bardolino Chiaretto Rose, Brolo Alto – Veneto** **2013 21.50**  
 Vibrant rose petal pink with fresh cherries and berries from a single vineyard, has a subtle, persistent and fruity bouquet on the nose with a dry and fresh aromatic taste. Brolo Alto is owned by the Montresor family near Lake Garda.

## ITALY WHITE

- 150 Pinot Grigio Terrazze della Luna – Trentino** **2013 19.95**  
 Superior Pinot from vines grown on the higher terraced slopes in the foothills of the Italian Alps that are indeed closer to the moon.
- 151 Gavi Nuovo Quadro – Araldica, Piemonte** **2013 22.95**  
 Gavi made from the local Cortese grape is becoming increasingly fashionable and this example is one of the best with aromas of white peach and acacia. A very drinkable wine with zesty citrus notes dancing on a textured well rounded palate. If you enjoy Pinot Grigio just try this.



**152 Le Giuncare Verdicchio Classico Riserva** **2007** **29.50**

A nose of fresh ripe tropical fruit with pineapple, mango as well as hints of ginger and spice. The palate has more fresh, honeyed tropical fruit and further complexity with hints of kerosene and savoury characters. This is a serious wine with stunning texture and luscious appeal.

**153 Terrazze Della Luna Nosiola** **2013** **21.00**

Ripe pear and apple notes are balanced by fresh, zesty acidity with juicy fruit, lightly textured notes and a crisp green edge. The indigenous grapes are sourced from the Calavino hills, in the Valle dei Laghi.

**154 Monte Grande Soave Classico – Veneto** **2011** **32.00**

An overt Soave, breaking the mould. Tending towards a gold colour in the glass. The nose is powerful with peach and citrus fruit laced with honey. A touch of acacia blossom and herbs lend a delicate intricacy. The palate is rich and plump with lemon fruit and a nutty almond creaminess. Minerality and good acidity lend a fine, balanced complexity to a voluptuous finish.

## ITALY RED

**155 Salice Salentino, Giardinelli – Puglia** **2009** **22.95**

The nose is ripe and openly fruity with hints of liquorice and raisins. The palate has a touch of spice, somewhat Syrah like, to balance the black fruit and ripe tannins – a wonderful balance of sweet ripeness and bitterness typical of Negro Amaro.

**156 Valpolicella Classico Ripasso, Capitel della Crosara – Veneto** **2012** **26.50**

If you like Amarone but not its price tag then try this single estate Valpolicella that is passed over ('ripasso') and into the vats that held the Amarone where it picks up some of those expensive flavours from the grape skins and lees to produce this silky more affordable version brimming with cherry berry fruits, cinnamon, musk and spices.

**157 IL Cascinone, Barbera d'Asti d'Annona** **2009** **29.95**

The Poet Giosue' Carducci praised Barbera by saying, "All who drink it feel invigorated". This suave top of the range wine is a perfect fusion of a careful selection of fruit from the vineyard and beautifully integrated oak. Rich, powerful and complex.

**158 Chianti Classico, San Felice – Tuscany** **2010** **29.50**

Very attractive cedar and spice on the nose, with lifted, perfumed notes. Flavours of coffee and dark chocolate with a subtle tar character and a long supple finish.

**168 Nebbiolo Martinenga – Piemonte** **2013** **29.95**

The delicate perfume of strawberry, red berries and spice is matched by crushed wild berries and black fruit on the palate. Abundant fresh raspberries, fresh acidity, smoky notes and rounded tannins combine to create this classic youthful style of Nobbolio.



- 159 Barbaresco Montaribaldi** **2008** **32.00**  
Ruby red colour with garnet red tints. Great and rich as only the nebbiolo vine can express. The viola and the rose blend well with the scents of plum, cocoa, tobacco, wood fruit and cinnamon
- ITALY RED**
- 160 Chianti Classico Riserva, Il Grigio Agricola – San Felice** **2009** **32.00**  
A nose of fresh plush red fruit and blackberries, with hints of a savoury character. The textured palate opens up to show dense rich fruit, plum cake and a hot dry earth character, layers of leather, spice and chewy savoury hints.
- 161 Pugnitello da San Felice Vitiarium Sancti Felicis** **2004** **42.00**  
The first release in the UK of Pugnitello, an ancient Tuscan variety that was re-discovered in 1984 in conjunction with the University of Florence as part of San Felice's research programme. Stylistically the wine is like a powerful Chianti Classico with more complexity & elegance. Awarded Tre Bicchieri in Gambero Rosso – the Italian wine equivalent of Michelin.
- 162 Campogiovanni Brunello Di Montalcino** **2008** **43.50**  
Deep ruby red. Offers up aromas of well-ripened wild berry fruit, blackberry preserves, tobacco leaf and tanned leather. An expansive, generous palate displays rich mouthfeel, developing into a long, persistent and fruit-filled finish.
- 164 Barolo Rocca Giovanni** **2008** **46.60**  
This most famous of wines comes from Rocca Giovanni winery in the Langhe hills of Monforte d'Alba, Piedmont. 100% Nebbiolo grapes are aged in Slovenian oak for 30 months and then in bottles for 7 months. The aroma is intense and fruity, with notes of cherry, prune, hazelnuts and cinnamon. A dry, full-bodied, harmonious wine.
- 165 Amarone Classico Capitel della Crosara, Montresor** **2008** **54.00**  
Turbo charged red from Valpolicella made by air drying the grapes in trays to produce an intense red black colour with lifted violet perfume and rich raisined fruit, hints of tangy cherry, dark chocolate and liquorice.
- 166 Barbaresco Martinenga , Marchesi Di Gresy** **2002** **62.00**  
Marchesi Di Gresy's Martinenga is considered to be one of the best single vineyards dedicated to the Nebbiolo grape – Light mahogany in colour with an orange rim. Fresh elegant nose showing floral notes, woodland berries, sour cherry, dried orange peel and clove. The palate is layered with bright red fruit and darker spice of cigar box.
- 167 Tignanello, Antinori - Tuscany** **2010** **139.50**  
The first and still the king of Super Tuscans, delivering a pallet of intense cherries, plums and tobacco followed by a complex concentrated pallet.



## AUSTRIA WHITE

- 170 Gruner Veltliner Breiter Rain, Sepp Moser** **2011** **32.00**  
Pale straw with a green tinge. Intense spicy fruit and a hint of smoke on the nose. Delicious textural quality on the palate, slightly honeyed and waxy yet with a fresh kick of acidity and a long, intense finish. Average yields are only 5,000 kg/ha, which accounts for the wine's amazing concentration.

## AUSTRIA RED

- 175 Blauer Zweigelt Reserve, Sepp Moser** **2009** **29.95**  
Velvety smooth with very appealing rich sour cherry, spice and vanilla notes. Stunning with roast beef or lamb.

## AUSTRALIA WHITE

- 180 Chardonnay, Stonefish – Hunter Valley** **2011** **16.95**  
A clean crisp example of Chardonnay with only a hint of oak that, in its simple style, manages to muster up Burgundian mannerisms on a palate that is rounded but fresh and easily approachable.
- 181 Keith Tulloch Sémillon – Hunter Valley** **2011** **24.80**  
Bright and lifted aromas of lemon and lime on the nose - hallmarks of this low-yielding vineyard and the cool Summer conditions. The strong fruit signatures flow brightly throughout, finishing with a grape fruit tang and lightness. Fine acidity is also a feature of great Hunter Semillons, and this wine shows the precise balance of crispness for the best potential in classic development.

## AUSTRALIA WHITE

- 182 Keith Tulloch Chardonnay – Hunter Valley** **2012** **24.50**  
This is a tight, bright, focused wine with a finer nucleus of fruit than usual, and this texture, balance and fine oak will therefore take longer in the bottle to intergrate and develop. These characters open out with breathing to reveal the typical barrel ferment funkiness – peach, melon and passion fruit plus hints of smoky vanilla oak – combining in a harmonious Burgundy-like balance.
- 183 Monsters Attack Riesling, Clare Valley** **2014** **27.95**  
Delicate floral notes on the nose and relatively restrained. The palate hits you with fleshy stone fruit flavours of apricot and white peach, with just a suggestion of “funky” mushrooms influenced by the natural yeasts from the vineyard.
- 186 Semillon Sauvignon, McHenry Hohnen – Margaret River** **2011** **28.50**  
This wine is a great example of the blend for which the region has become famous – aromatic, juicy and flavoursome with palate weight and texture: a crackerjack wine.



- 187 Tahbilk Marsanne, Central Victoria** **2006** **29.95**  
 An aging Marsanne giving attractive aromas of lemon meringue, honey, citrus and slight nuttiness adorns the nose, whilst flavours of baked apples, liquid honey, lemons and toast punch through, with racy acidity, a talcy texture, and a crisp finish.

### AUSTRALIA RED

- 191 Merlot, Stonefish – Hunter Valley** **2013** **16.95**  
 A soft, vibrant wine with juicy plum fruits, beautifully mollified tannins and just hints of vanilla are a pleasure to the taste.
- 192 Shiraz, Stonefish – Hunter Valley** **2013** **16.95**  
 Deep, opulent but soft at the edges, the Shiraz character has been tamed into lavish cassis extract. The wine has a very amenable style with a touch of spice and heat on the length for good measure.
- 193 The Rude Mechanicals – The Definite Article – South Australia** **2010** **24.40**  
 Bloody, hold and resolute. Shiraz and Petit Verdot vie for supremacy in a bottle of wills where you are the winner. We pushed for fruit punch with a grip, grit and girth, a bit like modernist style colliding with an old school tactility...ultimately and importantly, it should be about fun..."Col McBryde of Some Young Punks"
- 195 Mr Smith Shiraz – McLaren Vale** **2010** **24.50**  
 A preposterously lush Shiraz from some of the gnarliest vines we have ever seen, produce this dense, dark, brooding and incredibly impressive wine. A gold medal winning, black berry fruit blockbuster!.
- 196 Cascabel Tipico, Grenache/Monastrell/Shiraz – McLaren Vale** **2010** **25.80**  
 Cascabel are a tiny Mediterranean inspired winery in McLaren Vale owned by Aussie Duncan Ferguson and Spaniard Suzanna Fernandez. A great McLaren Vale blend. Grenache for perfume, Monstrell adding structure, and Shiraz giving spiciness and aging potential.
- 197 Magpie Estate 'The Black Craft' Shiraz – South Australia** **2012** **28.95**  
 Classic Barossa Shiraz with intense savoury favours of thick blackberry compote, black pepper and typical iron-rich beefy flavours. Not a hint of jam here, no sweetness, this is serious shiraz for grown-ups with balanced acidity, fine velvety tannins and tremendous length. Wow factor Decanter Wine Magazine - 95/100

The beautifully fragrant passion fruit, lime and basil leaf aromas are echoed on a complex but clean palate. A lovely fresh length is the reward for a cooler, early morning and night time harvest.

Winner of the Pinotage Trophy at the International Wines and Spirits Competition 2010. An orchestra of cherry tobacco and plum backed by pure red fruit Pinotage flavours supported by a good concentration of tannin and oak which is well integrated.
- 241 Peacock Ridge Merlot – Stellenbosch** **2011 23.50**  
A rich serious Merlot that would put many a St Emilion to shame with aromas of cassis and cedar wood followed by upfront brambly fruit laced with dark chocolate and mocha.

 One of my personal favourites, its full of spice and peppery fruit sitting over earth and chocolate. Its Sheer pleasure in a glass. A truly outstanding vintage.

**251 Château Musar, Hochar – Bekaa Valley** **2004** **39.80**  
 A blend of Cinsault, Cabernet and Syrah procreating a rich, dark, spicy wine of some power, with hints of cinnamon and nutmeg in Serge Hochar's inimitable style.

**252 Don Nicanor Malbec, Nieto Senetiner – Mendoza** **2012** **23.95**  
 Nieto has grown to be one of the leading stars of Mendoza and it's easy to see why with this classic Malbec from their premium Agrelo vineyard. Dark, velvety, dense blackberry & damson fruit with mocha notes – Just crying out for beef fillet.



## ARGENTINA WHITE

- 254 Amauta Absoluto, Torrontes, Valle de Cafayate– Argentina** **2013** **19.50**  
Lovely fresh tropical fruit and citrus blossom notes. Alsatian in style, with lovely eastern nuances of Rose petal, lemon grass and ginger. The palate is rich and aromatic, fresh and beautifully structured, With lovely rich ripe fruit and crispy acidity.

## CHILE ROSÉ

- 256 Adobe Syrah Rosé – Rapel Valley** **2013** **19.95**  
Wonderfully off dry wine that has a vibrant pink hue with aromas of fresh red berries. On the palate the strawberry notes persist with a long and juicy finish.

## CHILE WHITE

- 260 Sauvignon Blanc, Los Vascos – Colchagua** **2010** **22.80**  
From the fantastic Chilean climate on Phylloxera free soil overlooked by Dom. Phillippe Rothschild this should be good, and is. Vibrant aromas of cut grass and red currants top a clean, racy palate.

- 269 Cabernet Sauvignon Grande Reserve, Los Vascos – Colchagua** **2011** **29.95**  
Grapes are selected from the Estates' finest plots to shape a wine that is made using traditional methods to achieve high levels of complexity in a finely balanced wine with a persistent elegance.
- 270 Tabali Special Reserve Cabernet/Shiraz/Carmenere – Limari Valley** **2009** **29.80**  
Intense ruby red color with violet tinges. A fresh and elegant wine with an excellent sugar-acidity balance. It smells like cooked fruits: peach, plum, with some hints of liquorice, verbena and grapefruit. This Muscat is different from the other by its acidity and its freshness as a result of its low percentage of residual sugar.

**367 Muscat Beaumes de Venise, M Chapoutier - Rhône Valley** 37.5cl 2011 23.50

A traditional French dessert wine here with his Muscat de Beaumes de Venise. Using the Muscat Petit Grains grape, the wine is delightfully sweet with notes of candied fruits and flowers. A golden colour in the glass, the fruit is picked at its optimum ripeness.

**368 Domaine de Grange Nueve, Monbazillac** 55cl 2009 22.00

This is a fabulous dessert wine with a well-deserved reputation. It is a blend of three grape varieties, Sémillon, Sauvignon and a little Muscadelle. An extremely elegant wine from the home of dessert wines Monbazillac. The naturally occurring sugar results in it being sweet, it is unctuously luscious with a great backbone of fine acidity for a fresh finish.

**370 Domaine du Noble, Loupiac** 37.5cl 2005 22.50

Loupiac is a small commune across the river from Sauternes and enjoys similarly perfect conditions for the production of sweet, botrytised wines. Honeyed and rich with lime and sweet apple flavours this consistently surprises with its brilliance.

**371 Muscat de Beaumes de Venise, Domaine Durban - Rhône Valley** 75cl 2007 29.50

A subtle, slightly fortified wine from the terraced village on the slopes of Dentelles de Montmirail that shows delicate floral characteristics in a sweet but not cloying palate full of tropical intrigue.



**372 Château De Myrat Sauternes, Bordeaux** 37.5cl 2005 24.50

Chateau De Myrat Sauternes has a superb nose with orange zest aromas, exotic fruits, vanilla and spices. The wine is full bodied, silky and has great aromatic fullness. This wine has lots of sweetness with a very elegant balance.

**373 Château de la Chartreuse, Sauternes - Bordeaux** 37.5cl 2006 32.00

Exotic honeyed notes have now intergrated perfectly with the touches of spice and vanilla. The prodominance of Semillon in the blend lends a richness and a whisper of decadence.

**374 Banyuls, M.Chapoutier, Languedoc-Roussillon** 50cl 2009 32.00

Deep garnet in colour. Aromas of dried fruits, red fruits and cocoa, roasted coffee appearing with the years. Very powerfull, long length in mouth, the fruits and the chocolate are the major aromas of this very long aging wine.

## DESSERT WINE – ITALY

**377 Moscato Passito, Araldica** 37.5cl 2006 13.50

Unctuous and rich yet always refreshing, with cool fruit characters of elderflower, honey lemon and chamomile.

## DESSERT WINE – AUSTRALIA

**379 Noble Semillon Mitchell, Clare Valley** 37.5cl 22.00

A great, full-on, late harvest sweetie with a silky texture and excellent balance. Intensely concentrated tropical fruit flavours dance on the mid-palate. Made by stalwart Clare producers, Andrew and Jane Mitchell.

**380 Rutherglen Liqueur Muscat, Campbells, Victoria** 37.5cl 26.50

Lusciously golden, raised honeyed wine made from 100% Muscat à Petits Grains Rouge. Unique style from a fourth-generation winemaking family dedicated to continuing a tradition for characterful Rutherglen Muscats in an area where the extended grape-growing season allows these complex wines to be made.

**381 Black Noble, De Bortoli – Riverina** 37.5cl NV 29.95

Brazenly sweet and viscous, this is the one if you like them big. Rich, round and intense with stewed apricot, roasted walnut, spicy, buttery flavours and a long roasted, coffee marmalade finish.

A provocative rose and litchi aroma of Elysium resonate from the black Muscat grape.



## DESSERT WINE – CANADA

- 384 Proprietors' Reserve Vidal Icewine, Jackson-Triggs** 25cl 2007 22.50  
– VQA Niagara Peninsula  
This richly textured wine displays fresh tropical aromas of papaya, mango and apricot. Bold fruit flavours balanced with fine acidity caress the palate and conclude with an exquisite silky finish.

## DESSERT WINE – CHILE

- 385 Late Harvest Muscat, Tabali Encantado – Limari Valley** 37.5cl 2009 13.20  
A late harvest of grapes, the result is a wine with a complex taste of fresh papaya with floral hints and honey together with a special feeling of mature fruits.

## DESSERT WINE – HUNGARY

- 391 Tokaji Aszu, 5 Puttonyos, Crown Estates** 50cl 2007 38.50  
The one undisputed great wine of Central European History made from Botrytis – shrivelled grapes. This is superb amber elixier, like celestial butterscotch.

## DESSERT WINE – SPAIN

- 392 Antique Pedro Ximenex, Fernando de Castilla** 50cl NV 29.50  
“This weird, dark, mysterious, mahogany-hued wine is hypnotic, ever-so-slightly-halucinatory and unbelievably intoxicating. Happy, smiley and dare I say it, giggly, this is a dreamy, smooth, coffe, raisin, walnut and Christmas spice wine. This like liquid Connolly leather, only more amazing on the nose and more luxurious to the touch.
- 393 Casta Diva Moscatel, Alicante** 50cl 2011 28.50  
The nose is aromatic and floral – with notes of raisins, which follow through to the palate. A complex, full and deep-flavoured wine characterised by orange peel, nectarine, honey, spices, and great length. A fantastic dessert wine.

## DESSERT WINE – AUSTRIA

- 396 Riesling Beerenauslese, Sepp Moser** 37.5cl 2009 34.50  
Bright golden yellow in appearance. A medley of honeyed lime marmalade, apricot fruit and honeysuckle. The delicate fruit and floral flavours fuse well with a palate of black tea, honeyed lime flowers and a hint of dried apricots lifted by refreshing acidity at the finish.
- 397 Esterhazy Trockenbeernaulese, Burgenland** 37.5cl 2009 35.50  
Concentrated and rich with dried fruit, oranges and honey on the palate. Lovely weight and silkiness. From vineyards bordering Neusiedlersee in eastern Austria.



## DESSERT WINE – SOUTH AFRICA

- 398 Noble Late Harvest, Paul Cluver – Elgin** 37.5cl 2007 22.00  
Packed with apricot, spice and honey characteristics on the nose. The mouth feel is full and impressively rich but with superb balance, the result of elegant acidities. The aftertaste seems to linger forever. The perfect way to end a meal, or enjoy with flavourful cheeses.
